Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which is the official end of the Christmas season on the current liturgical calendar. However, here at St. Patrick's, we've celebrated the "long Christmas" over the last several years, leaving our Nativity scene up until Candlemas, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, on February 2nd (and starting this year, we'll be keeping ALL the Christmas decorations up—trees and lights, both indoor and outdoor, through Candlemas!). Christ was born for us, and has been made known to us in His epiphany—let us rejoice that our Savior has come!

Baptisms are one of my favorite sacraments to celebrate, as it is the beginning of new life in the souls of newborn babies, who are just beginning their earthly lives, and are now quickly claimed for Christ in the waters of baptism. This year, I look forward to baptizing adult converts at the Easter Vigil, which will be a new experience for me.

After three full years here, it's exciting to see the babies that I've baptized growing up, walking and starting to talk, and coming forward with their parents to receive a blessing at the Communion rail. It makes me think of the Easter hymn "O Sons and Daughters," which reminds us that through baptism, we all become sons and daughters of our Eternal Father in heaven. As a priest, I am reminded in a particular way that every baby I baptize becomes my spiritual son or daughter (there's a special connection we all have to the priest who baptizes us — we may go to hundreds of different priests for Mass or Confession, but there is only one who baptized us!). The baptism of a new baby or an adult convert is also a sign that the Church's mission of evangelization continues — one more soul is now reborn in Christ, and entrusted with the Gospel!

As we continue to celebrate and meditate on the mystery of our Lord's Incarnation and His manifestation to all nations, may we remember that we have been reborn in Jesus Christ, who configures us to Himself. And as He began His public ministry after His baptism, may we also remember how He now sends us forth to be His witnesses to all the ends of the earth.



FROM THE OFFICE OF THE APOSTOLIC PENITENTIARY

INDULGENCES FOR JUBILEE YEAR 2025

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin.

The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day.

To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met (usually, an *Our Father, Hail Mary*, and *Glory Be*).

- I. Make a Pilgrimage to Rome and pray for the Pope's intentions in any one of the Four Major Papal Basilicas (St. Peter's Basilica, the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, or St. Paul Outside the Walls) or any of the special Jubilee churches listed by the Apostolic penitentiary in Rome
- II. Make a pilgrimage to one of the following churches in Italy: Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi, Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi, Basilica of Our Lady of Loreto, Basilica of Our Lady of Pompeii, Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua, OR in the Holy Land: Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth
- III. Perform an extraordinary work of mercy such as a generous gift to the poor, or visiting nursing homes or prisons
- IV. Participate in diocesan or parish sponsored spiritual exercises, missions, or formation activities based on the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church
- V. Visit any local Cathedral, Marian Shrine, or other special church designated by the local bishop for obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence
- VI. Fasting at least one day a week from "futile distractions" such as social media, television, video games, certain phone apps
