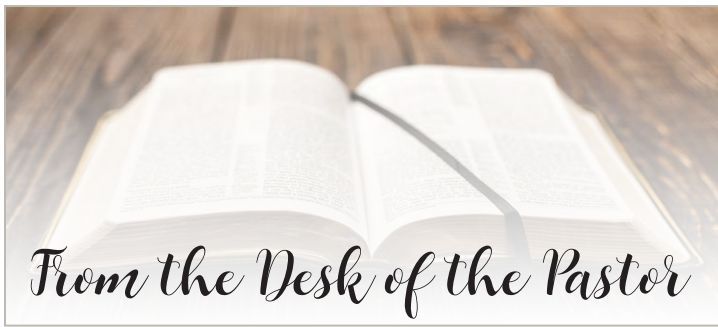

From the Desk of the Pastor

A few days before Christmas, I announced at all Masses that we were only a few thousand dollars short of reaching our pledge goal for *The Appeal*, which supports various ministries and activities throughout the Diocese of Columbus. Thanks to the generosity of you, our parishioners, we met our goal and then some! With a parish goal of \$153,636.70 set by the Diocese, as of this past Monday, we have pledged \$211,082.50, of which \$199,948.59 has been paid. This means that right now, \$46,311.89 is guaranteed to come back to the parish as a rebate (and this money will come back in full – it is not subject to the diocesan assessment of parish income). Thank you to everyone who has been so generous! I also mentioned when I addressed the parish last month that the money we receive as part of our rebate will go to two important projects for the parish – a new roof for the parish center and priory, and upgraded lighting for the church. Both of these are needs for our parish, and one is very timely.

Over the last couple of years, we have been finding a number of leaks in the parish center, and inspectors have discovered damage to the roof. It seems that this was caused by faulty ventilation during the initial installation of the roof in 2002, and made worse by hailstorms last year. So, we need to replace the roof now, in order to protect our beautiful parish center building. An insurance claim for this damage was denied, since the roof was already compromised, so the parish will have to fund the project itself. And, we will make sure that the ventilation is installed properly, so that the roof will last for many decades to come! The roof of the priory is also seeing its final years, and while there isn't an urgent need to replace that roof, it would be best to do so now while applying for permits and putting up scaffolding (though the Dominican friars reside in the priory, the building is owned by the parish).

Another need for our parish is replacing the lights of the church with LED lighting. On one hand, this is to help brighten our church and bring out the beauty of our sacred art and architecture. On the other hand (and more practically speaking), we're foreseeing an inevitable dilemma: the incandescent bulbs currently used in our church are no longer manufactured, so we are relying on whatever is left in the current stock. If we don't upgrade to LED lighting in the near future, we will eventually no longer have the necessary light bulbs for our church.

In discussions with the parish finance council, we are

considering the timetable for these projects, recognizing the immediate necessity of the roof project, and potential options for fundraising (while also recognizing that the lighting project can be tabled until 2026). I hope to have more information about this timetable in the near future. In the meantime, we still can benefit from *The Appeal*, which will continue until March of this year before the launch of the 2025 campaign. At this point, every dollar that you pledge and give to *The Appeal* will come back to the parish and support the new roof and lights. This will put us on a strong trajectory to fund these projects, without needing to dip too much into our parish savings. We will, in all likelihood, still need to finance part of the project with a loan from the Diocese's Parish Aid Fund, as we did with the church roof replacement and pipe organ renovation in 2018. A breakdown of current estimates and funding may be found on the chart on the next page. If you haven't given yet to *The Appeal*, I ask you to consider making a pledge or contribution at this time, in order to support these two major parish projects. While our parish has paid nearly \$200,000.00 of its pledges for *The Appeal*, this comes from just over a quarter of families registered in the parish. Imagine what that number could be if the other three quarters of the families made some contribution? Would you help our parish by making a donation to *The Appeal* before March? A new roof to the parish center protects the spaces that we use for parish social events, and the classrooms where our children are instructed in the faith. As a sign of stewardship and to set the pace for charitable giving, the Dominican friars have pledged a contribution to the roof project, intended to cover the priory roof.

In closing, thank you again to all who have contributed to *The Appeal* for 2024. Your generosity to the Diocese and to the parish is greatly appreciated. Please pray for our parish as we undertake these two important projects, which will benefit our parishioners for years in the future.

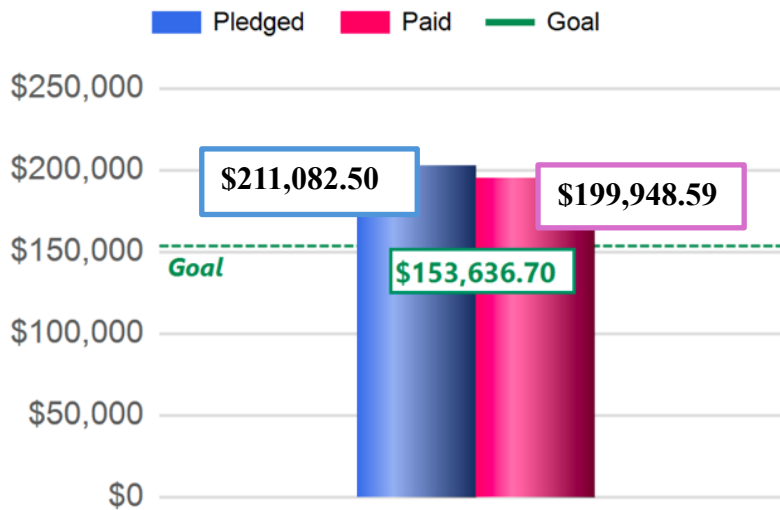
