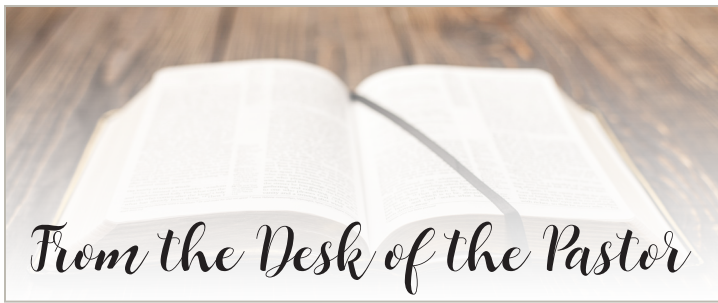

Last weekend, I wrote about some different ministries for men and women in the parish, as our Diocese celebrates the annual Catholic Women's Conference this weekend, and the Men's Conference next weekend. This Sunday, I wanted to tell you a little more about some new opportunities for prayer and devotion in the parish, which can help you deepen your faith all throughout the year:

Tuesday Eucharistic Adoration

At the beginning of Advent, we started weekly Eucharistic adoration on Tuesdays from 12:15 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. This allowed us to link the time between the 11:45 a.m. Mass and the high school youth group's regular time of adoration with a solid block of Eucharistic adoration (the high schoolers have their own time for adoration at 8:00 p.m. until Benediction at 8:30 p.m.). So far, the response to this added time of adoration has been positive. There were several reasons for increasing times for adoration at St. Patrick's. For one thing, as we just wrapped up the parish phase of the National Eucharistic Revival, this provided us an opportunity to "go deeper," and find a way to increase our love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Secondly, it allows adoration at a more opportune time, since our only other times for adoration up until now have been the Friday afternoon Holy Hour (which may not work for people who are working), and our all-night adoration on third and fourth Fridays (which is not the best time for families with young children or those who can't get up and get downtown during the night). These times of adoration will continue as usual, but it is my hope that Tuesday adoration will give a wider range of parishioners and visitors the opportunity to adore our Eucharistic Lord, especially if you are working downtown and stop in for a visit, or if your schedule permits you to come downtown during the week. Thirdly, since we have many parish activities on Tuesday evenings, I've been encouraging those who are already coming downtown for those events to come earlier and adore.

A special word of thanks to Steve and Amy Zehala for organizing the schedule of committed adorers and helping get this added time of adoration off the ground. They are still looking to fill a few more time commitments: please contact Steve at 614-274-5000, or Amy at 330-717-0367 if you would like to sign up. Even if you aren't scheduled to come at a set time, the doors of the parish center off the parking lot are unlocked during adoration; you don't have to be scheduled, nor do you need a key code to enter the church during these hours. Come and adore!

The Dominican Rosary and the Rosary Confraternity

For many years, the Rosary has been prayed after our 7:00 a.m. and 11:45 a.m. weekday Masses, and this continues as usual. Since last spring, our parish Rosary Confraternity has been meeting on the third Thursday of the month for a discussion on the Rosary, followed by the praying of the Rosary according to the Dominican method (which opens in a way similar to the Liturgy of the Hours). These meetings led to a discussion about expanding the Rosary to the weekends, and so we are now praying the Dominican Rosary before two of our weekend Masses: on Saturday afternoons at 4:30 p.m. (before the 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass), and on Sunday mornings at 8:30 p.m. (before the 9:00 a.m. Mass). Members of the Rosary Confraternity take turns leading the Rosary. I encourage you to come early and pray the Rosary before Mass, as this is a way to enter into the rich spiritual tradition of the Church and the Dominican Order. Meditating on the mysteries of the life of Christ with His Blessed Mother is also a great way to enter into the mystery of the Holy Mass. Pamphlets with instructions on how to pray the Dominican Rosary will be kept on the Rosary table near the Gallery entrance of the Church, and the Rosary Confraternity is looking for more prayer leaders (for information about leading the Rosary, contact Beth Atkinson at bethatkinson@msn.com).

If you have never been enrolled in the Rosary Confraternity, there will be enrollments after all Masses this weekend. The only requirements for membership are to pray fifteen decades of the Rosary each week, remembering the intentions of all the members of the Confraternity as you pray the Rosary. Members share in the good works of the Dominican Order. If you would like to be enrolled today, come up to the Communion rail after Mass (and consider coming to the next monthly meeting on Thursday, February 20th at 7:00 p.m. in the Kolbe Classroom).

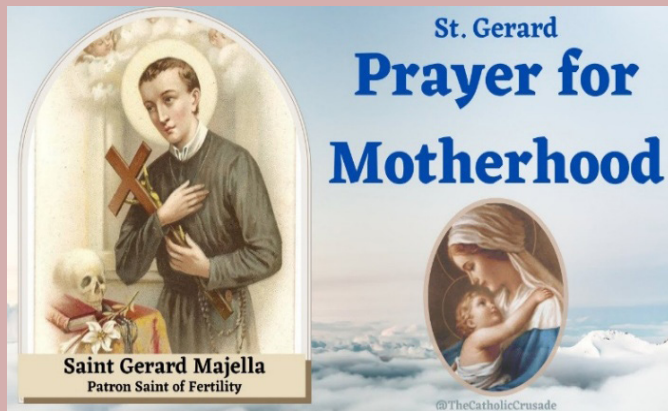
FRIENDLY REMINDER: NEW PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING MASS INTENTIONS

Please remember that the Dominican friars have adjusted the process for requesting Mass intentions. Mass intentions may no longer be scheduled over the phone or by email but must be made in person at the parish office or mailed to the office (with the check for the stipend). Mass intention requests without a stipend will not be scheduled until the stipend has been received, and stipends can no longer be paid by credit card or through *WeShare*. Checks should be made out to: "Dominican Friars" or "St. Patrick Priory." Individuals are limited to requesting six (6) Mass intentions for parish Masses in the church, but may request an unlimited number of private Masses offered in the friars' chapel in the priory. Finally, the Mass book for 2026 will not be opened until September of this year, in order to accommodate better planning for Mass novena intentions and the Mass intention requirements of the friars (such as the weekly Mass intentions for the people of the parish, or for the deceased Dominicans).
