Next week is the kickoff for The Appeal 2024; Staying connected to the divine lifeline.

Dear friends,

Next weekend is the kickoff for The Appeal 2024 for our Diocese of Columbus. Our theme for 2024 is "Respond to His Love," which connects to our present Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We can never repay the Lord for the infinite mercy and divine life that flows to us from his Sacred Heart, but we can show our generosity to him in our brothers and sisters, especially those who represent Christ and those who need a deeper relationship with Christ. The four key ministries to be supported in The Appeal 2024 are:

- **Evangelization:** Supporting families, parishes, and schools in missionary disciple formation is vital to fostering evangelization. This helps extend the reach of Christ's mercy and divine life to those who do not know him yet.
- Catholic Education & Tuition Assistance: Catholic schools are a ministry of the Church and lay the foundation for evangelization. Bishop Fernandes, with the help of Superintendent Adam Dufault and two of our Dominican sisters, Sr. Andrea Andrzejewska, O.P. and Sr. John Paul Maher, O.P., is working steadily to strengthen the Catholic identity of our Catholic schools.
- Vocations: The Diocese has been blessed with an increasing number of men discerning a vocation to the priesthood, including some from our own parish. We are looking forward to the ordination to the priesthood of two men from our parish next month: Deacon Tyler Carter and Deacon Michael Haemmerle. The Appeal is one of the key sources of support for the formation of our seminarians.
- Social Needs: Christ told us that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, we do for Him. Appeal funds will directly impact vital work in serving mothers and their children and defending life at every stage and condition. Support will also be provided for the coordination of the prison ministry to serve the spiritual needs of inmates in the twelve correctional facilities in the diocese. The Appeal will help the work of dedicated chaplains as they remind those in hospitals, prisons, and schools of God's presence.

Thank you for your generosity to last year's Appeal. Our 2023 parish goal was \$140,569, and we achieved a new parish record for pledges: \$220,038. This will yield an anticipated refund of \$79,469.

The goal assigned by the Diocese for St. Patrick Parish for The Appeal 2024 is \$153,636.

As always, 100% of funds received over our parish goal will be refunded to St. Patrick Parish, free of the normal Diocesan assessment. For several years, this annual refund has helped us complete key capital projects for our parish, such as replacing our church roof with a new slate roof, helping to rebuild and complete our pipe organ, replacing aging AC compressors in the church and parish center, and

currently working on the changeover to LED lighting for our church, and better illuminating the sacred art in our church.

A key capital project we presently face is the need to replace the roof of our parish center. It is now 20 years old and leaking in places. We are still receiving bids on this project and so do not yet know the total cost, but it will be significant. Your generosity to The Appeal 2024 will help us meet the expense of this important capital project, in addition to helping with key ministries of our Diocese.

Thank you in advance for your contribution to The Appeal 2024! We will provide pledge envelopes in the pews beginning next weekend. Please prayerfully discern your level of support, and know of my appreciation of the many sacrifices you make for the sake of our wonderful St. Patrick Parish!

In our Gospel passage this Sunday, Jesus invites us to abide in his divine lifeline.

To remain, abide (in the original Greek, *menein*) is an ongoing, mutual relationship:

Jesus provides us with life (invisibly, through grace)

We are to bear (visible) fruit, by his grace.

After all, the trunk of the vine conducts life in a hidden way, but the branches produce visible, tangible fruit. Yet even though the visible fruit comes from the branches, the branches absolutely depend on the vine.

How do we bear fruit?

- 1. Arranging our lives so that we will always be in contact with our source of life. Unlike a branch, we have freedom: we must choose to open ourselves to the grace God offers to us. The Gospels tell us of several occasions when Jesus withdrew to a place of solitude to spend time in prayer with his Father. Naturally, we need this regular contact with God, too. So, we try not to get separated from our divine lifeline. We keep praying, keep coming to receive the Eucharist at Mass, and keep listening to the Word of God.
- 2. **Allowing ourselves to be pruned.** Too many shoots on a branch means that the fruit will be small, because the nutrients are spread too thinly. If some shoots are pruned back, the others will grow stronger, and bear more fruit. Jesus tells us that we are pruned by his word. By focusing our limited time and energy on what will truly make us flourish and give glory to the Father, we will necessarily have to cut back on other parts of our life. This does not mean that we become boring people or religious fanatics. Jesus came that we might have life to the full, after all. It does mean, though, that in an ongoing effort we seek to cut off those branches of our life that contradict our calling from God, and moderate those branches that may be good, but spread us too thinly.
- 3. Allow God's grace to make a real, tangible difference in your life. This doesn't mean that we need to be constantly pointing out to others how much God is blessing us,

especially in a way that makes us annoying! Rather, we try to live our lives in a way that someone who knows us can see that we really try to live as a Christian; to act as Christ would act.

A prime example of abiding in the divine lifeline: Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Mary, the mother of Jesus, lived a relatively obscure life, and yet there is no other person who spent more time with Jesus, and there was no more perfect example of a disciple, and there is no saint more honored than her in Heaven.

She said yes to God's plan for her life, conceiving Jesus in her womb by the power of the Holy Spirit. She accepted the hardships and misunderstandings that surrounded this unusual pregnancy. She provided all for her Son that a mother should, in practical ways. She stayed close to him always. When he began his public ministry, and she couldn't always be physically close to him, she gave her Son first place in her heart. In this way she remained with Jesus, as a branch on the vine. And she continues to bear fruit by being mother to every one of Jesus' beloved disciples, helping us with her prayers.

Moms may not be famous, or celebrities, or influence large numbers of people. But if any one of us made a short list of the people who have had the most positive influence in our lives, Mom would probably be at or near the top. And Mary, the mother of Jesus, is the most honored of all the saints.

When we reflect on the key moments of Christ's life and the life of Mary, his mother in the Rosary, we are connecting our voices, our minds, and our hearts to the heart of her who was the most deeply connected branch to the Vine.



On May 13, the **Annual Fatima Rosary Procession** takes place in downtown Columbus in commemoration of the first apparition of Our Lady in the village of Fatima, Portugal on May 13, 1917. The procession begins at the Mercedarian Friars' Church, Holy Family, and proceeds through downtown, passing St. Joseph Cathedral, concluding at the Dominican Friars' Priory Church, St. Patrick. For those who are not able to participate by walking in the Rosary procession, St. Patrick's will expose the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration following the 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass. The evening closes with Benediction once the procession has arrived and entered the Church. In previous years, we have had an attendance which ranges from 700-1,000 people. It is truly a powerful opportunity to come together as the Church and to ask Our Lady's intercession for Peace in the world and for the Salvation of sinners. The presence of our Consecrated Religious and Consecrated Virgins has always been a blessing to all who participate.
