In just a matter of days, our nation will be going to vote in the upcoming election. Many of you may have already voted early, and I'd imagine that all of us will be glad when it's over and the endless cycle of political television ads will finally stop.

Voting is a right that we cherish, living in a democratic republic, but it also comes with its challenges. We can be discouraged to think that our vote may not matter, especially if "big money" is swaying an election. We may also find ourselves in a quandary as to who to vote for: this candidate's position on a certain matter contradicts the moral teachings of the Catholic Church, while the other candidate's position on a different matter also contradicts Church teaching. What is a Catholic to do?

First, it's important to remember the importance of going out to vote. Even if one abstains from voting for a specific office out of conscience, it doesn't mean that candidates running for other offices aren't worthwhile. The principle of subsidiarity is a part of Catholic social teaching which says that things should be handled on the local level as much as possible. One way this is carried out is by voting, especially for races that are closer to home.

When voting, I think there are a number of other things we can keep in mind to guide us in our decision. One is an understanding of voting as an exercise of the virtue of prudence. So often, we think of prudence as equivalent to being cautious, or watching our step in a difficult situation, lest we make something bad turn to worse. But this is only taking a part of prudence, when there is so much more to it. Prudence is called the "charioteer of the virtues," because it guides and directs all of our other virtuous actions. With prudence, we start by first deliberating about all the different possibilities when faced with a decision. From there, we make a judgment about which of these options is the best course of action. But then we reach the third step of prudence - carrying out the action which we've deliberated about and judged to be best. If we're holding back from acting out of extreme caution, we're actually not exercising prudence. Prudence is directed toward action, not inaction. This is true of all moral decisions, and it is necessary for us when making a decision on election day.

So often, politicians will say that their position on a certain issue is a matter "of conscience," which they use to end further discussion (in reality, they're using it as an excuse to justify a

wrong action). But this is a far cry from a proper understanding of conscience. No, the conscience is not the "little voice in our head," which we may have heard about as children, or got into our minds from meeting Jiminy Cricket in the story of Pinocchio. Our conscience is a "judgement of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 1778). The conscience doesn't just come out of nowhere, but needs to be formed, which happens when we read the Scriptures and the lives of the saints, study the teachings of the Church, and seek the moral wisdom of good and wise counselors and mentors. Prudence contributes to the development of our conscience, as the deliberation and judgment that we make in prudence are truly the judgment of reason which conscience is. As our consciences are formed because they are informed, likewise must our voting be informed - it doesn't just happen, but requires much thought and research on our part.

In closing, I encourage everyone to get out and vote: it's our right as American citizens, it's the way we determine our own governance, and it is how we make our voices heard, even if we have to compete with many other voices. All the same, it is important to remember what Jesus tells us: "my kingdom does not belong to this world" (John 18:36). We must be prudent stewards of the society in which we find ourselves while living in this life, because God has created us with an intellect and free will, which we use for right governance. But we don't live for a secular king, nor are we to put our trust in princes (Psalm 146:3). We live for Jesus Christ, our King and our Lord! God bless you,


