I want to share some news about new opportunities for prayer and ministry at St. Patrick's, especially as we prepare for the season of Advent in only three weeks!

The past year saw us go through the parish phase of the National Eucharistic Revival, culminating in July's National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Our parish hosted some special events with Eucharistic adoration, and had a number of catechetical talks on the Eucharist. Many parishioners had the opportunity to travel to Indianapolis for the Congress. Now in this third year of the Revival, when we find the call to go on mission, how do we keep our love for the Eucharist burning strong at St. Patrick's?

Starting on December 3rd, we will be expanding Eucharistic adoration on every Tuesday of the year, beginning at 12:15 p.m. (after the 11:45 a.m. Mass), and concluding at 8:00 p.m. This will be a chance to come and pray before our Eucharistic Lord, and hopefully at a more convenient time for working people and families (currently, our public adoration times are on Friday afternoons for one hour, and our two all-night Eucharistic adoration vigils for life and vocations). Having adoration on Tuesdays, when we have many parish events occurring in the evening, will also give parishioners a chance to adore before going to their parish ministry or event. We are still in need of committed adorers! In October, a group of mothers from the parish gathered for Eucharistic adoration, fellowship, and a group discussion. This was the first meeting of the Mother's Ministry — which our parish is seeking to have chartered as an official chapter of the Confraternity of Christian Mothers. This group is open to all mothers in the parish, and will meet on the first Thursdays of the month from 7:00-9:00 p.m. in the church and Aquinas Hall, with a second meeting on the third Thursday of the month at the same time. Are you interested in learning more about these new ministries and parish events, and all our parish ministries and organizations? Then I invite and encourage all of you to stop by Patrick Hall next weekend after all Masses for our Ministry Fair. Representatives from our parish ministries will be there to answer questions about our various ministries, and sign-up sheets will be available if you're interested in volunteering or joining a ministry.





CATHOLIC FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANTS!

St. Patrick Church and St. Patrick Priory have been awarded grants by the Catholic Foundation in the recent 2024 Responsive Grants cycle.

Parish Center Roof Replacement

The parish is facing the necessity to replace the roof on the Parish Center in 2025.

The roof had been installed in 2003 with the new construction of the Parish Center, reportedly with 50-year-old shingles. Over the last several months, as an increasing number of leaks were developing in the 20-year-old Parish Center roof, different roofers were summoned to investigate. Each firm reported the original roof installation was faulty and not enough ventilation had been provided. Thus, the roof has overheated for 20 years making the shingles brittle, causing their failure.

Additionally, the priory roof is over thirty years old, and in need of replacement.

The total cost of replacing the two roofs will approach \$200,000.

We applied for a grant from the Catholic Foundation to assist in the funding of this important and expensive project, and were awarded \$10,000, for which we thank the Foundation.

Barnabas Ministry

Many diocesan priests encounter difficulty when they desire to take vacation, attend a retreat, or take sick days. They often have to call 10 to 15 priests to find someone to cover for the sacramental schedule of their parish (or multiple parishes).

The Barnabas Ministry was started by Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P., a Dominican friar well known to members of St. Patrick's. His goal is to make the task of finding coverage for Masses and Confession times much easier for the priests of the Diocese of Columbus. With one call to Fr. Thomas, if the dates are open on his schedule, the diocesan priest can get coverage for a day, a week, or longer if needed. Fr. Thomas ensures that the parish's sacramental schedule can be maintained during a parish pastor's absence. The Diocese of Columbus pays Fr. Thomas a salary to keep him "on retainer," thus no fee is required of the parish which he helps. But his insurance – health, dental, and auto-related – is not covered and is a significant expense to St. Patrick Priory. The Catholic Foundation awarded a grant of \$20,000 to cover these expenses.

St. Patrick Church and St. Patrick Priory thank the Catholic Foundation for these grants!
