

Today is our annual Ministry Fair in Patrick Hall. A special word of thanks goes out to our Pastoral Council for organizing this event. I hope that all of you have a chance to stop in and meet representatives from our various parish ministries, and learn more about the ways you can help in the life of the parish. We are also a very busy and active parish, with various ministries and organizations, which are organized and built upon the four pillars of Dominican life: pray (based on our own life of prayer and worship), learn (based on our commitment to sacred study), connect (based on our community life), and serve (based on our own preaching and ministry). These are the hallmarks of a Dominican parish, and the friars and sisters of St. Patrick's remain committed to ensuring a parish that is respectful of the sacred liturgy, rooted in the Gospel and faithful to the teachings of the Church, a source of rich, family-friendly community, and a place where we can serve our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ.

There is a place for you to serve our parish, to give of your time, and to help our parish grow. If every parishioner could help with just one ministry or organization, imagine how even stronger our community would be, and how we could be a source of evangelization throughout the wider community. Consider how the Lord may be calling you! As our celebration of Thanksgiving draws near, we have an opportunity to think about this in an even deeper way, giving thanks to God for all the blessings that He has given us, and considering ways we can give back as an act of thanks and praise.

# LITURGICAL NOTE – USE OF INCENSE (AND A SPECIFIC RUBRIC)

The use of incense in the sacred liturgy is a sign of our prayers rising before God. Its use in liturgical worship predates Christianity, as incense was offered in Jewish liturgical rites, and continued into Christian worship. In the Roman liturgy, there are specific times when incense can be used (the Entrance Procession, Gospel Procession, Offertory, Consecration, and Recessional), and there are certain things or persons that are to be incensed with three swings (the altar crucifix, the Paschal Candle during Eastertide, images of our Lord, the Book of the Gospels, the priest, the people, and the Sacred Host and Chalice during the Consecration), while other things only receive two swings (namely, images and relics of saints displayed for veneration).

While incense is rich in its scent and enhances our worship, many people have allergies to incense, or are aggravated by the smoke it produces. At St. Patrick's, we try to accommodate everyone as best as we can, with certain weekend Masses having incense, while others Masses are incense-free. Our practice has been and remains the following: incense is used at the 5:00 p.m. Saturday Vigil Mass, and at the 10:30 a.m. and Noon Sunday Masses. On holy days, incense is used at the Noon Mass and the 6:30 p.m. Mass (on the day of the holy day; not the Vigil Mass). Incense is always used at Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament (which includes our celebration of Solemn Vespers during Advent and Lent). Special liturgies (such as Candlemas or the St. Patrick Vigil) will always have incense, and special schedules of Masses (such as Christmas and Holy Week/Easter) will indicate which Masses will have incense and which will be incense-free. There is one exception to the 9:00 a.m. Mass being incense-free: If it is a solemnity or a special event, and solemn torches are used. On these rare occasions, we will notify the parish about the change in the bulletin ahead of time, in case anyone relies on the 9:00 a.m. Mass being incense-free. In the next few weeks, incense will be used at the 9:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, November 24th (the Solemnity of Christ the King) and Sunday, December 8th (Bishop Fernandes' visit for the relics of St. Thomas Aquinas).

One particular note for the congregation to follow: At the Offertory, there is a special order of who is incensed: first the priest, then the people. If there are concelebrating priests, they are incensed after the principal celebrant, but before the people. While this is rare, because our parish has a religious community attached to it, we tend to have concelebrating priests more than other parishes, especially on major feasts. If incense is used at a Mass with concelebrating priests, when the thurifer goes to incense the concelebrants (and they all stand at their seats in the sanctuary), the congregation is to remain seated. The congregation should stand when the thurifer comes to the center of the sanctuary to incense them.

#### INSTALLATION OF NEW ACOLYTES AND NEW HEAD SERVERS


### Sunday, November 10th





#### **CATHOLIC FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANTS!**

St. Patrick Church and St. Patrick Priory have been awarded grants by the Catholic Foundation in the recent 2024 Responsive Grants cycle.

#### **Parish Center Roof Replacement**

The parish is facing the necessity to replace the roof on the Parish Center in 2025.

The roof had been installed in 2003 with the new construction of the Parish Center, reportedly with 50-year shingles. Over the last several months, as an increasing number of leaks were developing in the 20-year-old Parish Center roof, different roofers were summoned to investigate. Each firm reported the original roof installation was faulty and not enough ventilation had been provided. Thus, the roof has overheated for 20 years making the shingles brittle, causing their failure.

Additionally, the priory roof is over thirty years old, and in need of replacement.

The total cost of replacing the two roofs will approach \$200,000.

We applied for a grant from the Catholic Foundation to assist in the funding of this important and expensive project, and were awarded \$10,000, for which we thank the Foundation.

#### **Barnabas Ministry**

Many diocesan priests encounter difficulty when they desire to take vacation, attend a retreat, or take sick days. They often have to call 10 to 15 priests to find someone to cover for the sacramental schedule of their parish (or multiple parishes).

The Barnabas Ministry was started by Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P., a Dominican friar well known to members of St. Patrick's. His goal is to make the task of finding coverage for Masses and Confession times much easier for the priests of the Diocese of Columbus. With one call to Fr. Thomas, if the dates are open on his schedule, the diocesan priest can get coverage for a day, a week, or longer if needed. Fr. Thomas ensures that the parish's sacramental schedule can be maintained during a parish pastor's absence. The Diocese of Columbus pays Fr. Thomas a salary to keep him "on retainer," thus no fee is required of the parish which he helps. But his insurance – health, dental, and auto-related – is not covered and is a significant expense to St. Patrick Priory. The Catholic Foundation awarded a grant of \$20,000 to cover these expenses.
