This weekend, we welcome the relic of the skull of St. Thomas Aquinas to our parish. This is a momentous occasion — an event that I know will be unforgettable for our parishioners, and one that will bring several visitors to our parish. There has been extensive planning and logistics going into this visit, and I wanted to highlight a few special aspects of the relic visit (and those who contributed):

Holy Card: Parishioner and artist Bernadette Carstensen was commissioned to paint an image of St. Thomas Aquinas for a holy card commemorating the visit of the relic. The image is based on her painting of St. Thomas Aquinas in the *All Dominican Saints* painting, commissioned for the 800th anniversary of the Order in 2016, and which is displayed in Patrick Hall. Bernadette's parents, parishioners Larry and Winifred Carstensen, designed the back of the prayer card with a Prayer to St. Thomas Aquinas. These prayer cards will be placed on the reliquary before veneration by the Dominican friars, becoming third-class relics, and will be distributed to each visitor after venerating the relic (4,000 were printed – I hope we have enough cards!).

Embroidered Cloth: Eunice Hayes, who leads our Martha-Mary Sewing Circle, made an octagonal cloth for the reliquary to rest on during veneration, embroidered with symbols of St. Thomas Aquinas. The symbols include the sunburst (symbolic of his writings on the Eucharist), a pen (signifying his numerous writings), and a book (signifying his commitment to sacred study). After the visit of the relics, this cloth, which will become a third-class relic, will be framed and permanently displayed in the Parish Center to commemorate the visit.

**Volunteers:** Mike Melliere, one of our Sunday ushers and head of the parish Hospitality Ministry, has organized several crews of volunteers for the weekend who will help with everything from parking to hospitality to ushering. We have 120 volunteers to help make the logistics of this major event possible. Thank you to all who volunteered!

**Relic Guards:** Several alumni of Aquinas High School will stand guard by the relic during veneration, paying tribute to the patron of their alma mater. They will also be joined by members of the Knights of Columbus, and the Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre.

The Catholic Museum of Art and History will be lending us special candelabra, which will be lit on either side of the relic of St. Thomas during the veneration.

Confessions will be available during the veneration, and I am grateful to several diocesan priests who will be helping the Dominican friars in administering the sacrament of penance. Also, Aquinas Hall will be open as a catechetical room, with videos playing on the life of St. Thomas, as well as a table with several of his writings available for viewing. There will also be a table of memorabilia from Aquinas High School.

May the graces of this weekend, through the intercession of St. Thomas Aquinas, be abundant for our parish! God bless you,

#### DECEMBER 9th - A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

This year, the liturgical calendar has the rare occurrence of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 8th) falling on the Second Sunday of Advent. Because the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence on the liturgical calendar, the solemnity is transferred to the following day, Monday, December 9th. When this has happened in the past (as it last did in 2019), the transferred feast was not a holy day, and there was no obligation to attend Mass. However, a canonical question was presented to the Vatican by the U.S. bishops, and our country received a different answer — this solemnity must remain a holy day of obligation (even if it is transferred). This is because the Immaculate Conception is the patronal feast day of the United States, and no permission was ever given to suppress the obligation if the holy day fell on a Monday.

With this being said, Monday, December 9th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, *IS* a holy day of obligation this year. Our parish Masses will be at 7:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 12:00 Noon, and 6:30 p.m., and there will be no confessions that day. Because the feast falls on a Monday, we are unable to have a Vigil Mass on Sunday evening, since that would still be the Second Sunday of Advent, so we will have one less Mass than usual for a holy day schedule. Please ignore any liturgical calendars or publications which say it is not a holy day, since those were printed well before the new directive from Rome.





#### ST. THOMAS AQUINAS RELICS WEEKEND - Frequently Asked Questions

#### Information Volunteers Should Know to Assist Visitors

Q: Where do visitors go, once inside the building?

A: There will be an usher inside each of the entrances (west side/Grant Ave. and east side) who will greet visitors and refer them to the lines for veneration and/or confessions. Depending on the volume of people, the end of the line may be in Church; the Gallery; or Patrick Hall. The ushers will keep tabs on the lines and direct people accordingly.

Q: What's going on inside the Church and Parish Center during veneration?

<u>Church</u>: The relics will be exposed in the front of the sanctuary behind the <u>closed</u> communion rail gates. Two kneelers for veneration will be placed near the communion rail for veneration. Lines will form on each side of the main aisle in the Church nave (similar to lines for Holy Communion) to the back of the main aisle. Any overflow will be lined up on the south side of the Gallery. Any overflow from Gallery will be lined up in Patrick Hall.

Confessions will <u>not</u> be heard in the confessionals <u>in Church</u>.

The Church front doors leading to Grant Ave. will be locked from the outside, so no entrance from Grant Ave. And although those doors will be unlocked from the inside, all visitors are required to leave Church through the doors to the Gallery and NOT through those main Church doors.

<u>Gallery</u>: Line on south side of Gallery for veneration overflow from Church; Line on north side of Gallery for confessions

<u>Patrick Hall:</u> Overflow line for veneration (after Church and Gallery) and confessions, if needed, likely along the wall(s) in Patrick Hall; Drinks and snacks available; Tables and chairs will be set up; Volunteer headquarters

<u>Aquinas Hall</u>: Educational materials will be available in Aquinas Hall, including a video regarding St. Thomas Aquinas, the Order of Preachers and the relics.

<u>Library/Upstairs CCD classrooms</u>: Confessions will be heard in the Library and select classrooms on the second floor. Neither the library nor the CCD classrooms are open to anyone other than ushers and penitents (so not open to visitors "just looking around"). If needed, restrooms on the second floor may also be used.

The elevator will be available for penitents who prefer that to walking the stairwell to the second floor classrooms.

Q: How do confessions work that weekend, if confessions won't be heard in Church?

A: Penitents should get in the confessions line in the Gallery; they will be directed to the next available priest (no priest-shopping) in the library or second floor classroom.

All confessionals have a screen separating the priest and penitent. Act of Contrition will be posted in each confessional.

Q: For visitors who want to venerate the relics and then go to confession, is there a shortcut from the veneration line to the confessions line?

A: No, the lines are independent. After veneration, a penitent will need to go to the back of the confessions line.

Q: Where do visitors park?

A: On <u>Saturday</u>, visitors can park in any of the "regular weekend" lots — the church-owned lot behind the priory, the one adjacent (north) to it, and the lot on Grant Ave. On <u>Sunday</u>, visitors can park in any of the 3 Saturday lots or the large lot on the Columbus State campus (Lot 12-S) just east of Cleveland Ave. between Spring and Long Streets. Sunday parking volunteers will have a handout for arriving visitors, directing people to Lot S-12 from St. Pat's if the closer lots are full.

Q: Is parking free?

A: Yes, in the lots described above. For any other lots/street parking, visitors will need to pay in accordance with posted notices.

Q: What are the hours of public veneration of the relics?

A: Saturday 6:15-10:00 p.m.; Sunday 1:15-9:00 p.m. (with a break for Vespers from 7:00-7:30 p.m.)

Q: What about visitors still in the veneration line at 10:00 p.m. Saturday or 9:00 p.m. Sunday?

A: Everyone in line at those closing times will be allowed to venerate. No one will be added to the line after the closing times.

Q: What are the hours for confessions?

A: Saturday 8:00-10:00 p.m.; Sunday 4:00-7:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.-9:00 p.m.

Q: Can visitors take pictures of the relics?

A: Yes, but visitors will be asked to NOT use flash photography. And <u>no selfies</u> with St. Thomas!

Q: Are holy cards/3rd class relics available for visitors?

A: St. Patrick's has had a specially commissioned holy card made for the visit, which will be available to visitors after they venerate the relics. All of these holy cards will be placed against the relics beforehand by a friar, thus making them 3rd class relics.

Q: Can visitors touch the relics or the reliquaries?

A: No, and no exceptions.

Q: Can visitors touch an item they brought with them (holy card, rosary, etc.) to the relics, to make such items 3rd-class relics?

A: No, and no exceptions.

Q: How long can a visitor venerate the relics at the kneelers?

A: A visitor should remain on a veneration kneeler for **no more than two (2) minutes**, after which time an usher will ask the visitor to move along. After veneration, visitors may remain in the Church pews (not at the communion rail) to continue veneration and to pray.

Q: How long of a wait is the line for veneration? For confession?

A: Ask an usher for an estimate, as wait time will vary depending on length of lines.

Q: How can visitors make a donation?

A: Baskets will be placed in Church, Gallery and Patrick Hall for cash or checks. QR code will also be posted throughout the Parish Center, for online giving.

Q: Is any food/drink available?

A: Yes, drinks (coffee, bottled water, etc.) and snacks will be available at no cost in Patrick Hall, for visitors and volunteers.

Q: Do handicapped visitors get to start at the front of the lines for veneration/confessions? A: Yes. At Usher's discretion, handicapped visitors in wheelchairs or with canes, walkers (and those accompanying such visitors), may be escorted by an Usher to the front of the line.

Q: Do clergy/religious get to start at the front of the line for veneration?

A: Visitors (primarily clergy/religious) who have a "VIP" pass will be escorted by an Usher to the front of the line. VIP passes will have been distributed by the pastor in advance, and are not available from any volunteer.

Q: Is child care available while parents venerate the relics?


A: No. And children should not be left unattended in Patrick Hall or anywhere else

Q: Are there security personnel on the premises?

A: Yes, St. Patrick's will have uniformed parish security personnel on the premises at all times. Parking volunteers will also be stationed along the walking route between parking Lot 12-S and St. Patrick's.

Q: Are restrooms available in addition to those on the main floor of the Parish Center?

A: Yes, if a line forms outside any of the main floor restrooms, a Hospitality volunteer will ask those in line to go to the Gallery and ask an Usher for directions to additional restrooms. Usher will then direct visitors up the stairwell by the elevator to use the second floor restrooms (and, if necessary, the basement restrooms). Ushers will be posted on the second floor to direct visitors.


