



Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. For the families of our parish, especially those with small children, this feast gives us a moment to reflect upon an important reality of the Incarnation — that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, dwelling in a human family. Jesus was a baby like any baby, and Mary and Joseph had to care for Him as all parents are called to tend and nurture their children. If there is ever a stressful moment at home, or if you find yourself juggling all the duties of raising children, remember that you are not alone — Mary and Joseph were there too, caring for their tiny child, who is God in human flesh!

We also find ourselves on the last Sunday of the calendar year. With each passing year, it is not simply a turning over of the calendar, but also another mark in time since the birth of Christ. Until Christ returns, we'll keep track of the time in the number of years. From almost the very beginning of 2024, this year has been particularly transformative in my own life, as I received the news that I would become the new pastor on January 12th. And so began a five-month time of transition with Fr. Stephen Alcott before I took over as pastor on June 10th. Since then, time has flown — I can't believe that my installation as pastor by Bishop Fernandes took place exactly six months ago today!

But there was a lot more that happened at St. Patrick's in 2024 besides a change in pastor. Here are a few of the highlights of some other important events in the history of our parish which happened this past year:

- In April, the retirement of Susan Livingston as our parish secretary after 42 years of service.
- In May, the ordination and first Masses of our parish sons, Fr. Tyler Carter and Fr. Michael Haemmerle.
- In June, the celebration of the 25th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood for Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P.
- In December, the veneration of the relic of the skull of St.
 Thomas Aquinas, which drew around 3,000 people to our church.

Not to mention all the baptisms, weddings, funerals, and other important events in the lives of our parish families throughout this year, as well as our regular annual events like Candlemas, the St. Patrick Vigil and Procession, Holy Week, Confirmation, First Communion, the May Crowning, the

Fatima Procession, the Graduation Mass and Brunch, Vacation Bible School, and Rosary Sunday, to name just a few things. 2024 has certainly been a year of grace for St. Patrick's!

And now we enter into 2025 - a Jubilee Year! May this upcoming year of grace be filled with many blessings, from the One from whom all blessings flow!

INTRODUCING "DONUT SUNDAY"

In January, we'll be officially taking a new approach to our First Sunday Socials, after a couple months of experimenting with some options. Sunday, January 5th, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, will be the first official "Donut Sunday." Coffee and doughnuts will be available in Patrick Hall after all Masses on that Sunday. Going forward, Donut Sunday will normally take place on the first Sunday of the month all throughout the year (including the summers), unless there is some important calendar conflict (as happened this month with Thanksgiving weekend). In those rare cases, Donut Sunday will simply be moved to another Sunday of the month. We will no longer call these events "First Sunday Socials." Additionally, different parish ministries or outside organizations will usually have a promotional table set up in Patrick Hall on Donut Sunday, showcasing their ministry or organization. While there won't be donuts available after the 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass on the first weekend of the month, special parish social events (such as Trivia Night, spaghetti dinners, or the chili cook-off) will continue to begin immediately after the Vigil Mass, so there will be plenty of social events available for those who usually attend Mass on Saturday evenings (please note, these will not necessarily be on the first weekend of the month, but will vary). As a reminder, on other Sundays of the month, everyone is welcome to come to Patrick Hall for coffee and doughnuts from 10:00 a.m.-12:00 Noon; this is not just for CCD families. A special thanks to Marian Hyden, who has organized teams of volunteers for both Donut Sundays and for the other Sundays when CCD is in session. 

Poor Box: Funds dropped in the poor boxes in the church also support the various causes of Little Margaret's Charity.

Donations to Little Margaret's Charity through the 5th Sunday Collection and the Poor Box support parishioners in need, as well as a number of pro-life organizations, including Ohio Right to Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, Women's Care Center, PDHC, and Bethesda Healing Ministry. The poor and homeless of downtown are also aided by contributions to the Holy Family Soup Kitchen, Faith Mission, J.O.I.N., and the Community Kitchen.

Little Margaret's Charity also sponsors the annual **Giving Tree** at Christmas. The 2024 Giving Tree campaign enabled us to help nine families, a total of 40 individuals, enjoy a little brighter Christmas. - ➤ Have you moved away from your parents' home?
- Are you newly married and starting your own family?
- ➤ Are you over the age of twenty-one and/or making contributions?

- ➤ If you answered "yes" to any of the above, you may not actually be registered. Please stop by the Parish Office or visit our parish website to do so.

To avoid problems or misunderstandings, especially when planning Baptisms, Marriages, or other requests for the parish, etc., be sure that you are a registered and active member of the parish.

"WESHARE"THE PARISH'S ONLINE GIVING PLATFORM

Online giving helps ensure a reliable cash flow for the parish, allowing timely payment of expenses such as utilities and payroll, even when parishioners are away or unable to attend Mass for reasons of inclement weather or illness. WeShare, our online giving platform, allows you to make direct transfers from your bank account, or use debit/credit cards for your Sunday offering, as well as all Holy Day and special collections. Tightly integrated with our parish data management system, WeShare eliminates nearly all the parish's time-consuming tasks associated with the donation envelopes and bank bill pay: sorting and counting checks, preparing bank deposits, and manually entering each contribution. We are confident that you will find WeShare a convenient way to support St. Patrick's! It is easily accessible from the "Give" dropdown menu on the parish's web page at: www.stpatrickcolumbus. org. The system is also handy for paying fees such as CCD, Vacation Bible School, and more.

AUTOMATIC BILL PAY THROUGH YOUR BANK

Many parish families use their bank's automatic bill pay service for making their weekly offering. When doing so, please be sure to use your "envelope/ID number" where the system asks for your account number.

IF YOU HAVE CHANGED YOUR STREET ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, OR EMAIL ADDRESS

Please inform the office so that we may update your records.

YOUR ENVELOPE ID NUMBER IS IMPORTANT!

Each parish family or single member is assigned an ID number, commonly referred to as your "envelope number." Whether you use the monthly envelopes, the parish's WeShare online donation system, or your bank's bill pay service, we must have your "envelope number" to properly identify your donation as coming from you. It helps us to compile an accurate year-end statement for your tax preparation, and also documents your support of the parish should you apply for the parish school tuition grant.

NOTE: Checks placed in the collection basket at Mass <u>must</u> be in an envelope with your name written on the envelope, to ensure proper credit.

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTION DEADLINE

The deadline for charitable contributions to Saint Patrick Church for the tax year is December 31st. Please be mindful that your year-end giving <u>must</u> be <u>received</u> by December 31st in order to be deposited and credited to St. Patrick's account for 2024. All donations received after December 31st will be included in the 2025 end-of-year statement.

SPECIAL NOTE FOR WESHARE USERS: Processing your donation can take as long as seven days. We recommend that WeShare donations be made by December 28th to ensure credit in 2024.

GIVE SMARTER: SUPPORT ST. PATRICK CHURCH AND LOWER YOUR TAXES

You can use funds in your retirement account to support **St. Patrick Church.** The Charitable IRA Rollover allows donors who are 70 ½ years or older to transfer up to \$105,000 from a traditional or Roth IRA to a qualified charity like The Catholic Foundation, which manages the **St. Patrick Vocations Youth Endowment Fund.**

An endowment fund is a longer-term, sustained investment designed to provide a perpetual source of income to our parish. Regardless of your age, you can support **St. Patrick Church** while still qualifying for a tax deduction. Contributions to the **St. Patrick Vocations Youth Endowment Fund** can also be made in the form of cash, appreciated stocks, and other assets.
