Adopted by the Trinity, priesthood ordination anniversaries.

Dear friends,

In our second reading today, St. Paul proclaims:

For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!"

The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs.

Who is adopted?

An orphan: one without a (lasting) family, home, means of support, security, future.

Why is a child adopted?

Not to do a task, or to increase the wealth of the parents. Rather, in love: the parents long to give love; to create a relationship and sustain the child and help the child to flourish. The parents long to have an heir: someone with whom they can share their life, their goodness, their blessings, their happiness. Someone who will in this way become like them in what is truly best about them.

Recognizing this relationship has a profound effect on how we understand God, and how we understand ourselves.

We can be tempted to relate to God as his slave, or even as a kind of servant or employee. God is then the boss, and our relationship with him becomes <u>transactional</u>.

"If I follow the commandments of God, at least in what is essential, then God will take care of me/keep me out of trouble/at least keep me out of hell."

"If I can do enough things and say enough prayers that are pleasing to God, then God will give me what I'm asking for."

This is the approach taken by the rich young man who asked Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?", and had kept all the commandments, but balked at giving up all his property to follow Jesus as a disciple. Jesus, on the other hand, had looked upon the man with love.

This is also the approach taken by the Prodigal Son (as well as his older brother): they see their relationship with their father in terms of what he can give them for his wealth and what they can do for him in terms of labor.

The results of this approach tend to be distortion of God's true nature and fear, like the discouragement of the prodigal son who turns homeward to his father fully expecting his father's anger, and his own demotion from son to employee.

The father says: "Everything I have is yours."

God's approach is different: filial.

In the first reading, Moses reminds the people that God has chosen them, revealed his glory to them, and has even

taken them from the midst of another nation (Egypt) with great wonders. Egypt was a superpower of the time, and each nation, each people had its own gods in their own local jurisdiction. So it was indeed unheard of that a god would steal a people from slavery in another nation, in the territory of other gods.

But even more surprising is the results that God gets. The people he chooses do not turn out to be especially faithful, or persistent, or obedient, or grateful. Again and again they are turned away from God by unexpected problems along the way. But God still does not abandon them.

So also with Jesus: The disciples he chooses do not (at least before the resurrection) reveal themselves to be paragons of courage and faith and wisdom. But he continues to walk with them.

This shows that God doesn't look upon us as useful employees (thanks be to God). He looks upon us as his adopted sons and daughters.

When I was about five and playing with a matchbox car of a Corvette (which I thought was a very cool car), I remember my father telling me that he used to have a blue Stingray Corvette—a real one. I asked him why he got rid of it (we then had a green Buick station wagon). He said: "Because of you!" A Corvette only has two seats; when it was just him and Mom, two seats were enough—but not when I was born. Notice the shift from a transactional approach to filial approach!

The filial approach is also in Trinity: each Divine Person can say to the others: "Everything I have is yours."

In our Gospel passage, Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize, make more disciples, and keep his commandments. Yet this is more than a spiritual transaction, for he also says: "I am with you always."

Jesus wants us—and all spiritual orphans with no lasting family, security, or future—to be adopted into the communion of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, sharing as heirs to all that is good and full of life.

In the end, we hope to say to God as he does to us: "Everything I have is yours."






