This past week, I traveled to Oakland, California to join nearly 25 other recently ordained priests from the North American Dominican provinces for the Dominican Leadership Development Conference. It was a great opportunity to reunite with priests I studied with (including several ordination classmates), and to meet friars from throughout the country for prayer, community time, and formation talks on leadership.

One focus of the conference was how to discern and best utilize the *charisms* we receive from God. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines charisms as "graces of the Holy Spirit which directly or indirectly benefit the Church, ordered as they are to her building up, to the good of men, and to the needs of the world" (*CCC* 799). A charism is different from a vocation, which is a calling to a specific state of life in the Church, such as the priesthood, the diaconate, religious life, or marriage. Charisms are gifts freely given to all the baptized, which help to support the life of the Church in various ways. These are given to everyone, regardless of vocation, helping us live our common vocation as baptized Catholics – the call to holiness. God uses the many charisms that He gives to all of us for carrying out His work on earth.

While this conference helped us young priests to recognize our own charisms, which will help us better minister in our vocation as priests, what are the charisms that God has given to the parishioners of St. Patrick's? Our parish is a vibrant community, and many of our parishioners are involved through different ways in our parish life. But there is always room for more! If you haven't been that involved in our parish life, or if you are new to our parish, how can you respond to the charisms that God has given you? One aspect of a charism is that it is always done for others. What are the ways that our parishioners can respond to the gifts that God has given them, and use them for others? I invite all of our parishioners to reflect upon this more deeply in the weeks and months ahead. It is my hope that more and more parishioners can get involved in our different parish ministries. There always seems to be a particular need for catechists for our C.C.D. program, and we can do more to increase our personal outreach to the poor through Little Margaret's Charity. We also have new ministries, like the Daughters of Veronica sacristan ministry, our parish Rosary Confraternity chapter, and our Hospitality Ministry, which we are trying to build up. However, instead of seeing volunteer activity as something that we merely do, can we approach it as using the gifts we have received from God for the good of others? This is something I ask all our parishioners to ponder,

both those who are already involved in the life of our parish, and those whom God is calling to serve in new ways.

On another note, this weekend we are pleased to welcome to St. Patrick's Fr. Emmanuel Mulu, O.P., from our Province's Vicariate of East Africa. Father Emmanuel will preach at all Masses about the missionary work of the friars there (which is itself a particular manifestation of the charisms). Our second collection this weekend will support our Dominican missions in East Africa. Thank you in advance for your generosity! God bless you,

WEEKDAY PARISH DEVOTIONAL UPDATES

As of Monday, July 1st, we have begun praying the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel after all weekday Masses. After the priest gives the final blessing, he goes to reverence the altar, and begins the prayer before genuflecting and leaving the sanctuary. Additionally, the praying of the Angelus/Regina Caeli before Mass, already practiced before the 7:00 a.m. Mass, has been extended to the 11:45 a.m. Mass. Cards with these prayers are available in the pews, so that the faithful can use a consistent version of these prayers in common. The Novena to St. Margaret of Castello will continue to be prayed after each Mass on Wednesdays and will follow the prayer to St. Michael. The faithful are also reminded that the Rosary is prayed in common each day after the 7:00 a.m. and 11:45 a.m. Masses. On Fridays the Eucharistic Holy Hour is held from 12:15 p.m.-1:15 p.m.
