This past week, thousands of Catholics gathered in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress. Many from our parish have made the trip to the Congress, and the Diocese of Columbus was blessed a few weeks ago to have the Seton Route of the National Eucharistic Procession pass through, with special Masses and Eucharistic processions at a number of our parishes.

At St. Patrick Parish, the past year has been an opportunity to grow in our love for our Eucharistic Lord, especially through more times of Eucharistic Adoration, and several adult catechesis presentations on the Eucharist. As this second year of the National Eucharistic Revival concludes, which has been the parish phase of the Revival, I encourage parishioners – from those who have been here for years, to those who are new – to think about ways we can continue to deepen our love for the Eucharist. The parish phase of the Revival shouldn't end here, but should just be starting! Here are a few suggestions for how we can deepen our devotion to the Eucharist:

Daily Mass: Besides our regular Sunday Masses, our parish has Mass every weekday at 7:00 a.m., as well at 11:45 a.m. on Monday-Friday. If you can't make it to Mass every day, would you consider coming downtown for Mass at least once during the week, in order to deepen your love and reliance on Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament? If you can make it more than once, even better!

Eucharistic Adoration: Our parish has a Eucharistic holy hour every Friday from 12:15-1:15 p.m., concluding with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. We also have All-night Eucharistic Adoration on the third Friday of the month (praying for life), and the fourth Friday of the month (praying for vocations). I realize that these times are not the most convenient for a number of our parishioners, especially those with young families. One of my goals as pastor is to look for opportunities for increased Eucharistic Adoration during the week. In the meantime, would you consider coming for an hour during the times of Adoration that we already have, particularly on third and fourth Fridays?

As a way to deepen our devotion to the Eucharist, I have decided to conclude both of these all-night vigils of Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:45 a.m. on their respective Saturday mornings (rather than close with simple reposition, which had been our practice). This will allow us to experience the full grandeur of the Church's liturgy when it comes to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Decorum and Silence: When we enter the church, we are entering the holy temple of God; Jesus is present, and He calls

us to prayer and worship. This means that when we come to church, we are dressed appropriately, presenting ourselves before the Lord in a worthy manner. We mustn't be dressed for some recreational activity, nor in a way that is disrespectful or degrading to the body.

While the time before Mass has typically been silent, with some time for the prelude music to lift our hearts in prayer, it can often be rather noisy leaving church. It's one thing if a child is seeking the attention of a parent after a long Mass. It's another thing if we are carrying on full-voiced conversations as we depart church. I invite and encourage our parishioners to depart the church in silence, allowing the postlude music to keep us in a prayerful disposition as we go out from our church to proclaim Christ to a hungry world. When we reach the Gallery, it is then that we can greet our fellow parishioners and share in appropriate fellowship.

As the parish phase of the Eucharistic Revival concludes, we now enter the third year: missionary sending. As we receive our Lord each week in the Eucharist, we are then sent forth as witnesses of Christ. May this next year be a way for us to discern how the Lord wants us to serve His Church and proclaim His Word, all the while carrying our Eucharistic Lord within our hearts.


