
This past week was a wonderful time of celebration for the Dominican friars, sisters, and laity, as we remembered the Solemnity of Our Holy Father St. Dominic. The week began with a beautiful Sung Mass in the Dominican Rite for the traditional feast of St. Dominic on Sunday afternoon, celebrated by Fr. Innocent Smith, O.P. from the Dominican House of Studies. A special thanks is in order to the Lay Fraternities of St. Dominic for hosting our reception after the Mass. Then on Thursday, the friars of St. Patrick Priory celebrated their community Mass (also called a Conventual Mass) at the midday Mass, with Fr. Stephen Dominic Hayes, O.P., the prior, as the principal celebrant and preacher. These were beautiful celebrations to honor the founder of the Order of Preachers. Hopefully a number of you had a chance to stop in the Gallery and see our display about the history and spirituality of the Dominican Order.

The Dominican friars have served St. Patrick Parish since 1885; we are a Dominican parish, and the Dominican pillars of community, prayer, study, and preaching shape the life of our parish. Our celebration of St. Dominic shouldn't be confined to a week in August, but is something that should be constant. With this in mind, I am excited to announce a new endeavor at our parish – the establishment of the St. Dominic Shrine.

You may have noticed that the sedilia, the threeseated bench that used to be in the Gallery, is now in the sanctuary. This is a beautiful piece of liturgical furniture, serving as the priest's chair (along with seats for two assisting deacons, if necessary). Up until now, we had only been using it for Dominican Rite Masses, but now it will serve its purpose in the sanctuary for all Masses. In its place in the Gallery will be a new shrine in honor of St. Dominic, incorporating the statue of St. Dominic that was acquired during the church renovation in 2003. For several years, the statue sat next to Our Lady at the side altar in the Church; however, when reredos (the ornate wooden backdrops) were carved for the side altars around 2011, the statue was placed as a decoration in the west stairwell. We were never able to find a proper place for St. Dominic in the Church or Gallery. By

placing the St. Dominic Shrine to the right of the Sacred Heart Shrine (and opposite the St. Patrick Shrine located at the East Entrance), my hope is that it will deepen our reflection and devotion. As we walk down the Gallery, gazing upon the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we will have St. Patrick and St. Dominic on each side, guiding us to the Heart of Christ.

For now, the St. Dominic statue will be placed on temporary stands in the Gallery, but the plan is to install a permanent pedestal and votive candle holders for the shrine. My thanks goes to architect and parishioner Daniel DeGreve for his artistic rendering of the new shrine (see photo below). If you are interested in contributing to this new endeavor, please contact me.

UPDATED PROCEDURES AND POLICIES FOR REQUESTING MASS INTENTIONS

Everyone is welcome to have Masses offered by the Dominican friars at St. Patrick's. Masses may be offered for both the living and the deceased. Please note a few updates to the procedures and policies for requesting Mass intentions:

- Masses may be offered publicly in the parish church (an "announced" intention), or privately in the priory chapel (an "unannounced" intention). The donation for announced or unannounced intentions is \$10.00, which is a stipend received by the friars once the Mass is offered.
- One may schedule no more than six announced Mass intentions per year in the church. However, one may schedule an unlimited number of unannounced Mass intentions to be offered in the priory chapel.
- Requests for Mass intentions may only be done in-person at the Parish Office during regular business hours, or may be sent to the Parish Office through U.S. Mail (with a check included). Mass intentions cannot be received over the phone or through email.
- The donation for Mass intentions must be paid when requesting a Mass. Masses will not be scheduled without a payment (we cannot accept "I.O.U.s" for Mass intentions).
 Payment can only be made through cash or personal check; we will no longer accept credit cards or *WeShare* online giving for Mass intentions.
- Special intentions or anonymous Mass intentions cannot be offered in the parish church as announced intentions. These will only be scheduled in the priory chapel as unannounced intentions.

The friars regret any inconveniences these new procedures and policies may cause, especially if anyone has been used to making donations electronically or scheduling over the phone. The friars have recently restructured their own bank accounts, and the stipends for Mass intentions are received by the Dominican friars, not St. Patrick Parish. The regulation of donations for Mass intentions is governed strictly by canon law, and differs from other types of giving to the church. These new procedures and policies will ensure that all transactions for Mass intentions are done efficiently, and in line with Church law. Thank you for your understanding!


