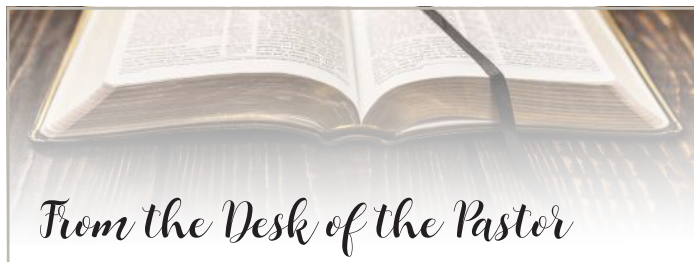

From the Desk of the Pastor

This weekend, we begin our celebrations in honor of Our Holy Father, St. Dominic. I encourage you to stop in the Gallery after Mass to see our exhibit about the history and spirituality of the Dominican Order. Hopefully, this will be a chance to learn a little more about the Dominican charism which forms our parish.

I also encourage you to come to our special Masses in honor of St. Dominic: on Sunday afternoon, when we will have a Sung Mass in the Dominican Rite for the traditional feast of St. Dominic at 3:00 p.m. Our Lay Fraternities of St. Dominic will be hosting a reception afterward, and we are grateful for their hospitality. On Thursday, August 8th, the Dominican friars at St. Patrick's will be celebrating our Community Mass at the 11:45 a.m. Mass for the Solemnity of St. Dominic. Father Stephen Dominic Hayes, O.P., the prior of St. Patrick Priory, which be the principal celebrant and homilist, and several friars will be concelebrating the Mass. Please note that this Mass will run longer than usual, as we will have music and incense for the celebration. Confessions will start late, immediately after Mass, but we will have three confessors scheduled that day to make up for the later start.

Our parish picnic last Sunday was a great success! It was a great opportunity for our parish to come together for quality community time, and also a chance by our volunteers to give back to the parish. I want to offer a special word of thanks to all our volunteers, notably the Pastoral Council for planning and preparation, the Knights of Columbus Council #11207 for cooking the meat, and to all the volunteers who chipped in to help when called upon. Thank you!

Community is a pillar of Dominican life, and a priority for me as I begin my time as pastor of this parish. We as members of the Church are a community rooted in Christ, and it is important for us to have opportunities to build this community as a parish. This is why I'm excited to share with you a renaming and rebranding of a very important parish ministry – the St. Pat's Fellowship, formerly known as the Marriage and Family Life Ministry. At its founding, this ministry was created to offer support to married couples and families, with social events as one aspect of it. Over time though, the social aspect of the ministry became more prominent, while some people thought this was a ministry that was only open to married couples and families. Plans for reviving and rebranding this ministry have been underway for the last few months, and now I am excited that this part of our parish life will be relaunched next weekend.

The St. Pat's Fellowship seeks to build friendships among the parishioners of our parish, which they will do by hosting social events and other activities which support the parish community. The St. Pat's Fellowship will be hosting an Ice Cream Social next Sunday as a way to re-introduce this ministry (and they are looking for volunteers to help plan and organize our parish social events!). We're looking forward to scheduling many revived and new social events on our parish calendar in the months ahead. This will be a great way to meet new people at our wonderful parish!

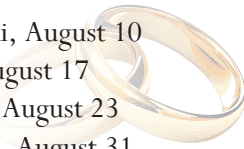

UPDATED PROCEDURES AND POLICIES FOR REQUESTING MASS INTENTIONS

Everyone is welcome to have Masses offered by the Dominican friars at St. Patrick's. Masses may be offered for both the living and the deceased. Please note a few updates to the procedures and policies for requesting Mass intentions:

- Masses may be offered publicly in the parish church (an "announced" intention), or privately in the priory chapel (an "unannounced" intention). The donation for announced or unannounced intentions is \$10.00, which is a stipend received by the friars once the Mass is offered.
- One may schedule no more than six announced Mass intentions per year in the church. However, one may schedule an unlimited number of unannounced Mass intentions to be offered in the priory chapel.
- Requests for Mass intentions may only be done in-person at the Parish Office during regular business hours, or may be sent to the Parish Office through U.S. Mail (with a check included). Mass intentions cannot be received over the phone or through email.
- The donation for Mass intentions must be paid when requesting a Mass. Masses will not be scheduled without a payment (we cannot accept "I.O.U.s" for Mass intentions). Payment can only be made through cash or personal check; we will no longer accept credit cards or *WeShare* online giving for Mass intentions.
- Special intentions or anonymous Mass intentions cannot be offered in the parish church as announced intentions. These will only be scheduled in the priory chapel as unannounced intentions.

The friars regret any inconveniences these new procedures and policies may cause, especially if anyone has been used to making donations electronically or scheduling over the phone. The friars have recently restructured their own bank accounts, and the stipends for Mass intentions are received by the Dominican friars, not St. Patrick Parish. The regulation of donations for Mass intentions is governed strictly by canon law, and differs from other types of giving to the church. These new procedures and policies will ensure that all transactions for Mass intentions are done efficiently, and in line with Church law. Thank you for your understanding!

Support the Collection for the Church in Latin America

Christ calls his disciples to love God and to love our neighbor. We Catholics can show love for our neighbors by performing corporal works of mercy, which include feeding those who are hungry, giving shelter to those who are homeless, and visiting prisoners.

For more than 50 years, the US bishops' program to aid the Church in Latin America has helped the Church carry out its pastoral mission of mercy among those with both spiritual and material needs across Latin America and the Caribbean.

In Mexico's Diocese of Iztapalapa, much of the population lives below the poverty line and has trouble meeting basic needs. The crime rate is high. Offenders who complete their jail sentences face rejection and isolation and risk reoffending upon their return to society. With grant support from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the diocese created the Cristo Redentor evangelization center, where persons released from prison can receive job search help, group therapy, spiritual direction, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And they can participate in recreational activities such as theater, games, and music, all at no charge.

In Venezuela, economic hardship and political turmoil have caused food shortages and a migration wave that has left behind vulnerable people, such as seniors. Without adequate resources, the elderly are particularly vulnerable to health problems, malnutrition, and homelessness. The Diocese of Carúpano, with help from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, established a social dining room at its Casa de la Caridad Santa Ana, where it provides nutritious lunches and spiritual and medical care to 100 people every day. The diocese also delivers bags of food and supplies to an additional 80 people every week.

These works of mercy are made possible through the generosity of Catholics in the United States to the Collection for the Church in Latin America.

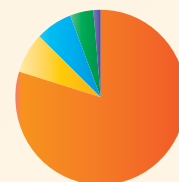
