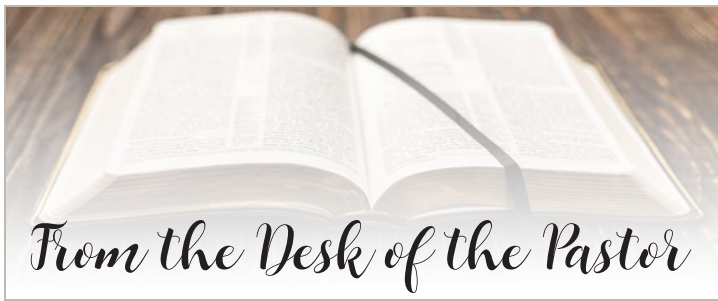

An integral component of parish and priestly ministry is the pastoral care of the sick. When the faithful have become seriously ill, or when they are dying, the Church is ready with her sacraments to help them receive the Lord's grace and strength, especially if they are on their journey home to the Lord. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was instituted by Christ to help those who are in danger of death due to some illness. Those who receive this sacrament are strengthened during their illness, and become more fully conformed to the mystery of the Lord's Cross. Though a physical healing is not always expected after receiving the sacrament, sometimes those who receive it do have their physical health restored. In decades past, the sacrament was called "Extreme Unction," which saw it as something intended for the moment right before death. Sometimes it was mistakenly called "Last Rites," but this phrase applies to receiving several sacraments before death: penance, anointing, and the Eucharist.

Recently, Bishop Fernandes issued new guidelines for priests in the Diocese of Columbus on the anointing of the sick, which helps us better minister to those who are in need. One key component of the Bishop's directives is the importance of going to Confession before receiving the Anointing of the Sick. While sins are forgiven by receiving the Anointing of the Sick, this is more for those who are impeded from making a confession due to unconsciousness or the inability to speak. Those who are capable of making a confession should do so before being anointed. Another important directive addresses who can receive the sacrament. It can be received by those who have reached the age of reason who are in "danger of death." This doesn't necessarily mean "at the point of death," but when illness or old age puts one at risk of death. Moreover, because this sacrament is for those who have reached the age of reason, infants or small children (usually under the age of 7) cannot receive this sacrament.

A major question comes up about the sacrament and elective surgeries. There are certainly surgeries that are risky, and put one in danger of death by the very nature of the surgery. However, other procedures may be considered elective. Some have thought in recent years that going under anesthesia was sufficient grounds for receiving the Anointing of the Sick, but this is not the case in the Bishop's new directives. If one is facing an elective surgery, it would be wise to make a good confession, and perhaps ask for a blessing from a priest before the surgery.

At St. Patrick's, the friars are available to care for our parishioners in need during their time of illness. Some may be wondering: "Whom do I call?" or "How do I contact a priest?" There is always a friar "on duty" at St. Patrick's, carrying the hospital phone for emergency calls that come in. If you ever find yourself in a medical emergency which requires the sacraments for someone in danger of death, please don't call the secretary, or even the priests' office extensions. Call (614) 224-9522, and when prompted, press "8" to connect you to the priest on duty. This will ensure smooth communication for moments of emergency. Priests will come to homes or hospitals and other medical facilities during these moments of crisis.

If parishioners find themselves homebound, they can request a priest to visit them at their home or in a rehab/nursing facility, usually every month to six weeks. The priest would be available for confessions and if necessary, the Anointing the Sick, and he will also bring Holy Communion. For those who are homebound and who would like to receive the Eucharist each week, an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion can bring you Holy Communion on a weekly basis. If someone who is ill or homebound ever needs to schedule monthly visits from a parish priest, and/or for an extraordinary minister to bring Holy Communion weekly, please call the office to make arrangements. I am pleased to announce that parishioner Judy Leddy will be helping me coordinate our team of Extraordinary Ministers with our homebound parishioners.

If you're not sure if you can receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, or if you need more guidance on the best spiritual care during times of illness or convalescence, please get in touch with one of the parish priests for more information and direction. We are here to help you during your time of need!

GENTLE HOUSEKEEPING REMINDER – SUNDAY CONFESSION LINES

As the school year and many of our parish activities restart, this is a gentle reminder from the friars about our protocols for the Sunday Confession lines. The Confession lines will be closed five minutes before the beginning of Mass (when the bells ring and the lights are turned up). The priest will try to stay in the confessional after the start of Mass for anyone who is still in line when it is closed (however, there may be occasions where he has to tend to something else, and will have to leave with people still in line). Please be in line before the five-minute bells ring if you want to have your Confession heard; do not enter the line once the signs have been placed and the lines are closed. Once the lines are closed, please remain in your line; do not go to the other side if it happens to be shorter. Additionally, for the 10:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Confessions (as well as on weekdays), please wait until the previous Mass is over to form the confessional line; do not get in line while Mass is still ongoing.

IMPORTANT UPDATES TO MARRIAGE PREPARATION TIME

Over the last few months, the Diocese of Columbus has been implementing new marriage preparation guidelines, which are in line with instructions from the Vatican regarding the time of marriage preparation. In the past, the minimum time for marriage preparation was six months. However, marriage preparation will now be using a catechetical model, similar to the one used for the baptism of adults, which will increase the time of marriage preparation to 9-12 months. Effective September 1, 2024, all couples interested in getting married at St. Patrick's must submit a *Marriage Request Form* at least 9

months before their intended wedding date. Additionally, if either the bride or groom would be under the age of 19 on the date of their wedding, a longer waiting time must occur between the conclusion of marriage preparation and the wedding date, and a parent consultation meeting must occur. Any exceptions for a shorter time of marriage preparation must be made in writing to the pastor.

NEW PROCEDURE FOR TAKING UP THE SECOND COLLECTION

Beginning with our next second collection (on the weekend of September 15), there will be a new procedure for taking it up, which will hopefully prove more efficient and less distracting. Instead of taking up the second collection after Holy Communion (while the priest is purifying the vessels), the second collection will now be taken up during the offertory, immediately after the ushers take up the first collection. Once the ushers deposit the first collection (which is the regular Sunday offering), they will come up while the faithful are still seated during the preparation of the altar to take up the second collection (which benefits a special mission in the diocesan or universal Church). This will allow us to contain the time in which collections are taken up to one part of the Mass, while allowing the faithful to have more time for prayer and meditation after receiving our Lord in Holy Communion. Additionally, the lector will announce the recipient of the second collection at the end of the Universal Prayer, improving communication regarding our second collections. Please be aware that loose cash and change placed in the first collection goes to the parish, while loose cash and change placed in the second collection goes to the specific beneficiary.
