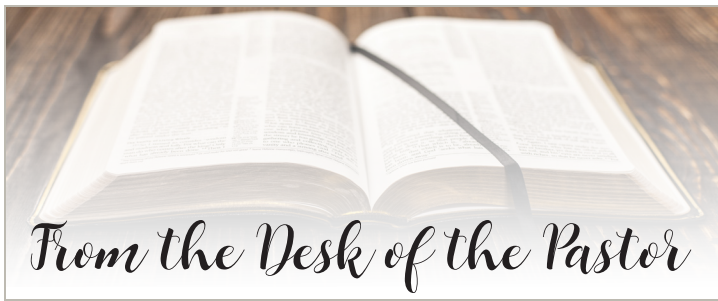

Since the beginning of July, our weekday Masses have concluded with the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, a devotion that is attributed to Pope Leo XIII (who was pope from 1878-1903). In the late 19th century, Pope Leo saw the importance of this devotion as a means of seeking angelic assistance against the forces of evil that threaten the Church. This practice was typically prayed after Low Mass, and many continue to pray it each day as a devotion (with many incorporating it as part of their daily Rosary). For many years, the praying of the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel after Mass fell out of use, but it has experienced a resurgence in many parishes over the last several years. The recitation of this prayer after our weekday Masses has gone quite well, and I've decided that the time has come to extend this practice to our weekend Masses. However, I knew that this would involve some additional logistics, so that everyone would be on the same page (notably, would we pray the St. Michael Prayer before or after the closing hymn). Discussions with friars, parish staff, the pastoral council, and parishioners have led to an adjusted plan that I didn't foresee when considering this devotion, but which will expand our embrace of Catholic traditions.

Anyone who has prayed the Liturgy of the Hours, notably the office of Compline (Night Prayer), may be familiar with the seasonal Marian antiphons – short poetic verses that are similar to hymns, sung in honor of Our Lady. Four antiphons are sung based on the liturgical season: the *Alma Redemptoris Mater* (Loving Mother of the Redeemer), sung during Advent and Christmastide; the *Ave Regina Caelorum* (Hail, Queen of Heaven), sung from Candlemas through Lent; the *Regina Caeli* (Queen of Heaven), sung during Eastertide; and the *Salve Regina* (Hail, Holy Queen), sung from Pentecost until Advent. Since there are no specific requirements about the closing hymn of Mass in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, in many places these Marian antiphons have been expanded to the conclusion of Mass, as a way to honor Our Lady during the recessional.

With this in mind, beginning on the weekend of September 28th and 29th, we will sing the seasonal Marian antiphons in place of a closing hymn at the end of our weekend Masses. The antiphons will cover enough time for the altar boys and priest to make it from the sanctuary to the rear of the church. Once the antiphon has concluded,

the priest will begin the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, which the congregation will recite together (cards with the text will be available). At the organist's discretion, a postlude musical piece will follow. On certain solemnities (notably Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, Corpus Christi, and Christ the King,) when we have brass to accompany the organ, we will sing a hymn specific for the feast. It is also my hope that the Marian antiphons and Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel after Mass will allow us to foster a better sense of silence as we leave Mass, since talking should wait until after we've left the church.

Next week, I will explore the theological and catechetical reasons for these liturgical adjustments in my column. I also want to invite you to join me and Kathleen Tully, our Director of Music, to a special presentation on Tuesday, September 24th, in which we will discuss the history, theology, and musical background of the Marian antiphons and the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel.

Fifth Sunday Collections: Four times a year, during the months which include a fifth Sunday, the 2nd Collection at all Masses benefits Little Margaret’s Charity.

Poor Box: Funds dropped in the poor boxes in the church also support the various causes of Little Margaret’s Charity.

Donations to Little Margaret’s Charity through the 5th Sunday Collection and the Poor Box support parishioners in need, as well as a number of Pro-life organizations, including Ohio Right to Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, Women’s Care Center, PDHC, and Bethesda Healing Ministry. The poor and homeless of downtown are also aided by contributions to the Holy Family Soup Kitchen, Faith Mission, J.O.I.N., and the Community Kitchen.

Little Margaret’s Charity also sponsors the annual **Giving Tree** at Christmas. The 2023 Giving Tree campaign enabled us to help 15 families, a total of 68 individuals, enjoy a little brighter Christmas. Parishioners donated over \$4,000 in gift cards, and nearly \$5,000 in cash, to assist these parish families.
